Time to reflect

"I will see and will remember" God says, putting the bow in the clouds. Has that ever struck you as odd? Why would God need an aide memoire? Well, maybe the answer is that God doesn't. But we do. We need a reminder, a prompt, a visual aid that reconnects us with the Divine. Think Spire, tower, cross, church building even, and there is a little bit in each of us that notices and, even momentarily, finds encouragement in our faith journey. Just as the rainbow has, as it were, God on one end and creation on the other, so those ecclesiastical buildings act as a sort of glue between ourselves and the Lord. In a culture that is growing even more disconnected from organised religion, churches (and in Bury, particularly our own Church), have a vital presence.

God "remembers". God is not forgetful, careless or dismissive of us. He wants to re-member us, to put back together our divided selves, to re-join our bodies and souls, to re-unite our humanity and his divinity. Our Lenten journey is time set aside for us to note just how far our inner-selves and our outerselves have drifted apart. We need to be remembered and this holy season invites us to give priority to this task, to give space for God to work on and in us, that we might become more like those who live like and for Jesus.
