Time to reflect_

We are slowly having to learn to be sophisticated with what people tell us; to sift, to check other sources, to pause before reacting. Is this 'doubt'? or is this a reasonable way to inhabit our world?

We are not the first generation to succumb to 'pleasure overload' and the suppression of critical faculties. The Roman Emperors used to keep the unemployed and unemployable citizens of Rome quiet with a diet of free bread and circuses. Our minds are suppressed with a heavy overdose of media, sport and alcohol. It's a 'Brave New World'.

I suspect we have lazily fallen into a sort of credulous mindset that believes in almost anything and have only recently woken up to the fact that people will happily manipulate us for their own ends. Now we are simply suspicious of everyone and everything.

So our Easter stories should appeal to us now in ways that perhaps former generations didn't quite get. For these stories are full of suspicion and uncertainty and doubt; Mary Magdalen doesn't recognise the guy she'd had an intense encounter with, women flee in fear, Thomas doesn't believe his mates, Peter and the beloved disciple entirely forget everything they've ever heard Jesus say. The disciples don't believe each other, they don't believe "men in white", they don't even, as today's gospel tells us, believe Jesus. Or don't immediately. Faith takes time. And actually, it takes time after time, moment by moment movement from distrust to doubt to questioning to belief. So how's your faith today?
