'Church for a Different World' is the strap line of our Diocese. The thinking is that our inherited patterns of Church life needs to reflect the world in which we now live. Whatever we think that 'Church' means, for most people in our country the word refers to the building. What this means is that church buildings, if they are to speak to the world today, need to offer opportunities for people to encounter the things we hold precious and sacred in an as easier way as possible.

Here are the words the diocese would like all churches to think about when it comes to our church buildings; They should be the centre of our communities, vibrant places providing a range of services for all. We should constantly challenge ourselves to improve our church buildings to create spaces that can adapt to changing worship styles, articulate our mission, welcome people and meet the needs of the community.

I wonder where we are in this conversation? The fact that Bury Parish is open almost daily is a fantastic asset. That does mean that people can come in, can find refreshment for the body in the café, for the soul in church and for the heart in the sheer beauty of the building. That is great.

The diocesan challenge, however, invites us to think beyond what has been achieved. How suited are we to explore additional different worship? Do visitors immediately know what our mission is (do we)? Is our welcome generous, joyful and inclusive? How geared are we, with our various buildings (not just church) to respond to the needs of our community?
