Time to Reflect

In the fifteenth year ofwhen Pontius Pilate was governor....and Herod was ruler, and Philip ruler and Lysanias ruler during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas..the word of God came to John In other words, says Luke, the writer of our Gospel this liturgical year, this story I am about to tell.... happened. It happened in this time frame and in this place and these were the secular "big men". This is real history. And, as we shall see, into this real history God inserts himself.

I love the start of Luke's Gospel. Luke is a story teller but he wants us to know that this story is not a myth, not some dreamy experience drafting free from reality like the myths of the gods of Rome and Greece. Real events, real people, real places are involved. He does the same in part 2 of his writing, the book we call "The Acts of the Apostles". Go see.

And what is the first thing that Luke tells us that happens? Luke tells us that John (who turns out to be Jesus' cousin) started a preaching ministry. More specifically, it was a ministry of correction, of admonition. Here's one of the keys to Luke's Gospel; Luke focusses on our amazing capacity to make a mess of things. That's his diagnosis of the human condition. We mess up.

And his treatment for our condition? Luke says that God has the cure. The cure is found in confession, in humility, in seeking forgiveness. The cure is found in Jesus, in allowing him to enter into us and transform our lives by his presence. And, says Luke, watch how Jesus behaves and learn from him.
