# Time to Reflect

So here's a test; if I start "Blessed are you among women" can you finish the rest of the line? For those who can (and those who point out that this text has already started and I've missed a bit out) the likelihood is that either you were brought up and/or educated in Roman Catholic circles or you have been exposed to a generous, broad, 'catholic' Christianity. If you don't know what I am talking about or if you find your hackles rising, then either your Christian education was at the more Protestant end of things or you have somehow become resistant to all things "Mary".

Today we hear the encounter between Mary and her cousin Elizabeth. Like the early bits of Luke, what we hear is women talking. And what we listen into more specifically is women exploring God's involvement in their lives. And what we even more specifically hear is Elizabeth recognising that her younger relation is different, is special because the child she is carrying is different and special. 'Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb'.

The Christian spiritual tradition around Mary flows not from Mary but from Elizabeth. Why that should make some hostile to Mary is anyone's guess. Like Elizabeth, we also ought to honour the place that Mary carries for carrying Jesus. God's choice was not random. In a church dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, Elizabeth's prayer ought to be simply part of our spiritual armoury too. We ask Mary to pray for us, that we too might carry Jesus in our hearts.
