You are faithful and trustworthy; may our words be seeds of goodness for the world: where there is **shouting**, let us **practice listening**; where there is **confusion**, let us **inspire harmony**; where there is **ambiguity**, let us **bring clarity**; where there is **exclusion**, let us **offer solidarity**; where there is **sensationalism**, let us **use sobriety**; where there is **superficiality**,

let us raise real questions; where there is prejudice, let us awaken trust; where there is hostility, let us bring respect, where there is falsehood, let us bring truth. Amen.


