Time to Reflect

Here's a word you know and don't know you know. "Gesima". It appears in the old name for the three Sundays before Lent; Septuagesima, Sexagesima and Quinquagesima. Essentially we are in count down; 70, 60, 50 days before Easter (approx. for you fastidious counters). These are pre-Lent Sundays, preparation before the Season of Preparation, as it were.

And today, Quinquagesima in old money, the Sunday next before Lent in common currency, always has a version of the story of the Transfiguration, that occasion when Jesus takes his closest mates and goes up the mountain. Why do we hear this reading on this Sunday, the Sunday next before Lent?

It's a strange reading, involving shadowy figures, clouds, divine voices and anxious over-enthusiastic reactions. And the temptation is to unpick the experience, to rationalise, to speak knowingly of Jesus fulfilling the Old Testament, of mountains being "closer" to God, of silly disciples missing the meaning. That's the temptation. Most preachers (me included) find this safe ground.

But what if... what if this story is really a lot simpler than that? What if this story simply invites us to pause, in our preparation before the Season of Preparation, and think about the Jesus whom we are to follow closely throughout Lent? What if, as we hear this story, we step, with Peter, James and John, onto the mountain and stand with Jesus? No more, no less. And what if, as we stand, we decide to spend a bit of time, each day, doing the same? If we did that, then that would be preparation indeed.

A reading from the book of Exodus

(Exodus 34.29-35)

Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand. Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the LORD had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face; but whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him. Glory to You, O Lord

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah"--not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said. "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.
