"Functionally speaking, most mainline Christians are Unitarian in spirit, if not theology. Although we recite the creeds from time to time, the doctrine of the Trinity is vaque, confusing, and for the most part irrelevant in most congregants' experience. Mainline Christians tend to focus on God as a whole, creator and parent of all things, and Jesus, the way-show-er, immanent in our world." (Bruce Epperly; the Adventurous Lectionary 13 May 2016)

I wonder whether that's true for you, supposing you give any thought at all to God? That you think about God as creator and Jesus as "example" and then stop? That the Trinity is simply too complicated and different and only for clever people?

We sing hymns about the Trinity; "Holy, holy, holy" (obviously), "Thou, whose almighty word", "I bind unto myself today" and so on. We expect a Trinitarian blessing at the end of the Eucharist. We say the Creed and the Grace. And then what? What do we believe? How does/could this idea, this "theology", make any difference to me, to us, to our world? Just what does our collect today even mean?

So, a thought; Unity and diversity. God calls us to be one, as he is one; one body, one faith, one church. And God, three persons, calls us in our rich diversity of race, language, age, gender. God calls us to work with and for those who are different, who have different hopes and experiences, politics and economics, to reflect his own richness and complexity. That, it seems to me, turns "theology" into ethics, ideas into action, thought into deeds.
