Where do people start a journey of adult faith? For some, it comes with the flash of a kingfisher, a sunlit hillside or the mystery of new birth. It starts in beauty. For others it comes in an overwhelming sense of oneness with the whole universe or a sense of almost physically being lifted up in gratitude for life, for love, for this moment, these people.

And for others.... It's an awakening both to a visceral sense of inadequacy or of some catastrophic act in the past or on-going, dull, repetitive deed in the present. An awakening to sin. Stories of "Damascus Road" experiences, of life turned round by flashes of self-awareness, terror and grace, are rightly part of the Christian tradition. Think "Amazing Grace" or Corrie ten Boom in the concentration camps, or of meetings between Japanese soldiers and prisoners from the Burma Railway. That's what 1 Timothy is about today.

For many of us, sin is what other people do. 'We' make mistakes, have little foibles, get a bit lost.

There has been a collective loss of the sense of sin in culture. And maybe some of that is not too bad. Guilt and shame can crush our humanity. Too much emphasis on sin can warp our sense of the possibilities of life. Sometimes our liturgy (and the Book of Common Prayer does this in spades) can burden us with a vision that we humans are miserable specimens rather than offering us a vision of beings who reflect the beauty and grace of God.

But make no mistake. Sin is real. We need grace and forgiveness. We need to note when we have lost part of that beauty and need God to come and help us find it, to dust us down, and help us start again.
