Mission Action Plan

This week sees the last of the meetings in our initial listening exercise on the possible ways in which God is inviting us to move into his future.

I have been around long enough to know that we live in a time of rapid, challenging and complex change economically, culturally, politically. And I have been in ministry long enough to have experienced waves of anxiety from both parishioners and the "Centre" about the impact of these changes on the life of the local Church. Putting it bluntly, the church, which once was at the centre of social and community life, has found itself on the edge. Sadness, anger, frustration and uncertainty are just some of our emotions that flow from this.

It is enormously tempting to point a finger at one person/event and put all the blame on him/her/that. It might be satisfying (except for the person we "dump" on) but it would be untrue and unkind and ill-informed. Along with imagining there is only one cause, we might equally imagine there is only one solution. An equally tempting, comforting but false and deceptive assumption. Fake News as it were.

Perhaps the Church will never regain the place it had. But that does not mean we should do nothing. MAP invites us to take ownership of the future. Or, theologically, to take co-ownership with God. So, with the Lord, let us seek renewal of mission and ministry in ways to puts God back on people's agenda and Bury Parish Church as a place where people can experience His presence in their lives.

This will be the last of the short reflections on Mission Action Planning. Next week, we are back to reflections on the scripture readings.
